PRESENTATIONS

h New Staff /Faculty:

An orientation program is offered to newly hired staff and faculty members.

The University Student Government Association provides information through peer counselors concerning alcohol and drug abuse.

in the UMB community. R.A.D. begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction, and risk avoidance before progressing to the basics of hands-on defense training. Basic and advanced courses are taught to students, faculty, and staff by UMB Police and Public Safety instructors.
